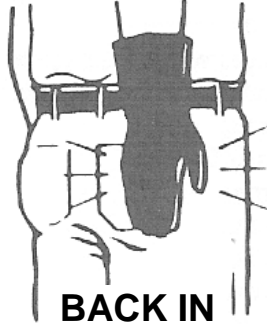

Topic 656: Hand Signals (Concrete Operations)

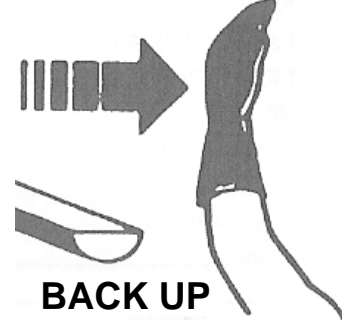

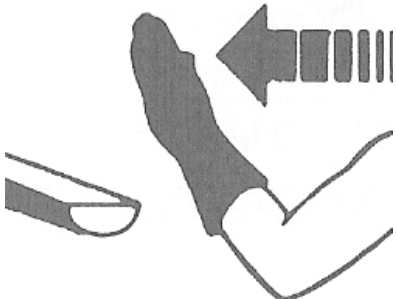

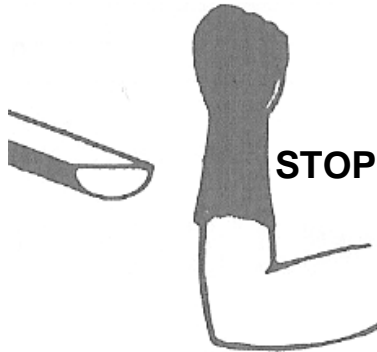
BACK IN



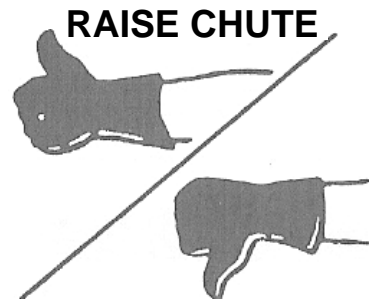
BACK UP



PULL FORWARD

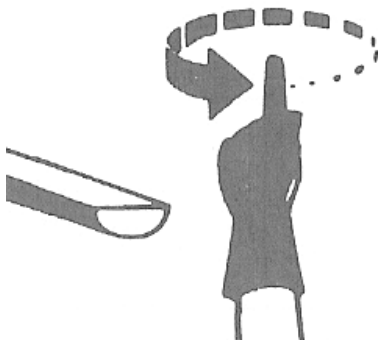


STOP
