Safety must be your first thought as you drive to work to begin the day's work, and it needs
To think safety first, last, and	in-between ask yourself:
■ What is my best, safest rou	te to work or the job-site? Is my vehicle properly maintained and safe to drive?
	t I will need to do the job safely?
■ What methods will be used	at the job-site today to complete the work? What will be required to do the job safely?
■ What personal protective e	quipment or clothing will be necessary to accomplish the work safely? nal protective equipment and clothing for defects prior to use.
What tools are necessary to equipment properly trained	complete the day's task? Are the personnel who will be using the tools or to do the work safely?
■ Do these tools or equipmen	t require special training or certification? Who has received that special training or certification?
■ Be sure to inspect all tools	and equipment prior to use. If defects are found have them repaired or replaced prior to use.
■ Inspect the job-site or wor	c area prior to beginning work. Look for any changes or hazards which you may be unaware of.
	derstand what the days work will encompass. If there are any hazards related needs to be done to minimize or eliminate those hazards?
Practice good housekeeping	g throughout the day. Eliminate any possible hazards as they arise.
Stay alert throughout the d	ay. Be aware at all times of what is happening around you, and around your co-workers.
Upon completion of the da	y's work be sure to properly clean and store all tools and equipment in a dry, secure place for future use
■ Make sure all barricades o	guards required are in place before leaving the job-site.
Ensure that all equipment	is properly parked and secured for the night.
Will I need any special too	Is or equipment to accomplish the work safely tomorrow?
■ What is my best, safest rou traffic to diminish before h	te home? Would it be wiser to get a cup of coffee and wait a short time for eading home?
<u>Conclusion</u> : Think safety first, la job. Accidents are usually a result	st, and every moment in-between. Planning and attention to details pay off in a safer, more efficient of lack of attention or lack of planning, and are preventable almost 90% of the time.
